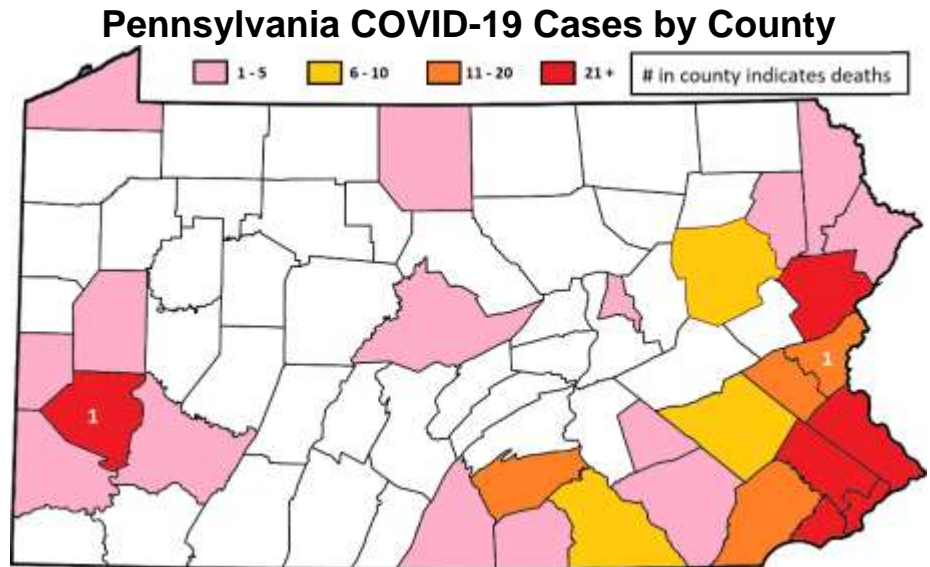

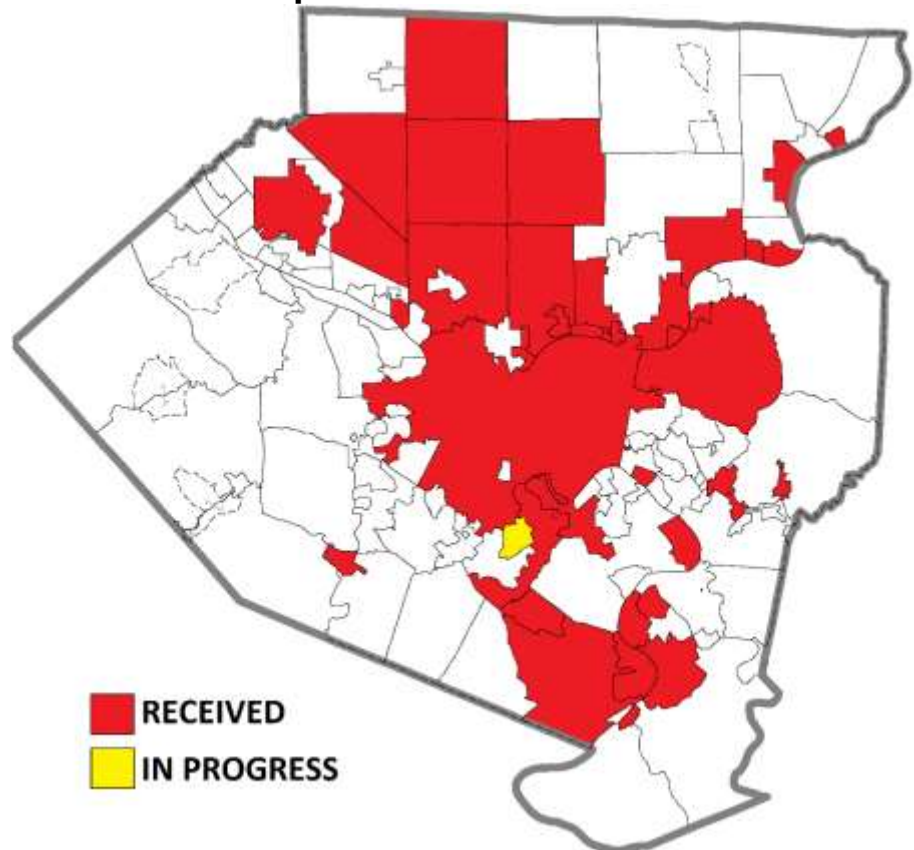

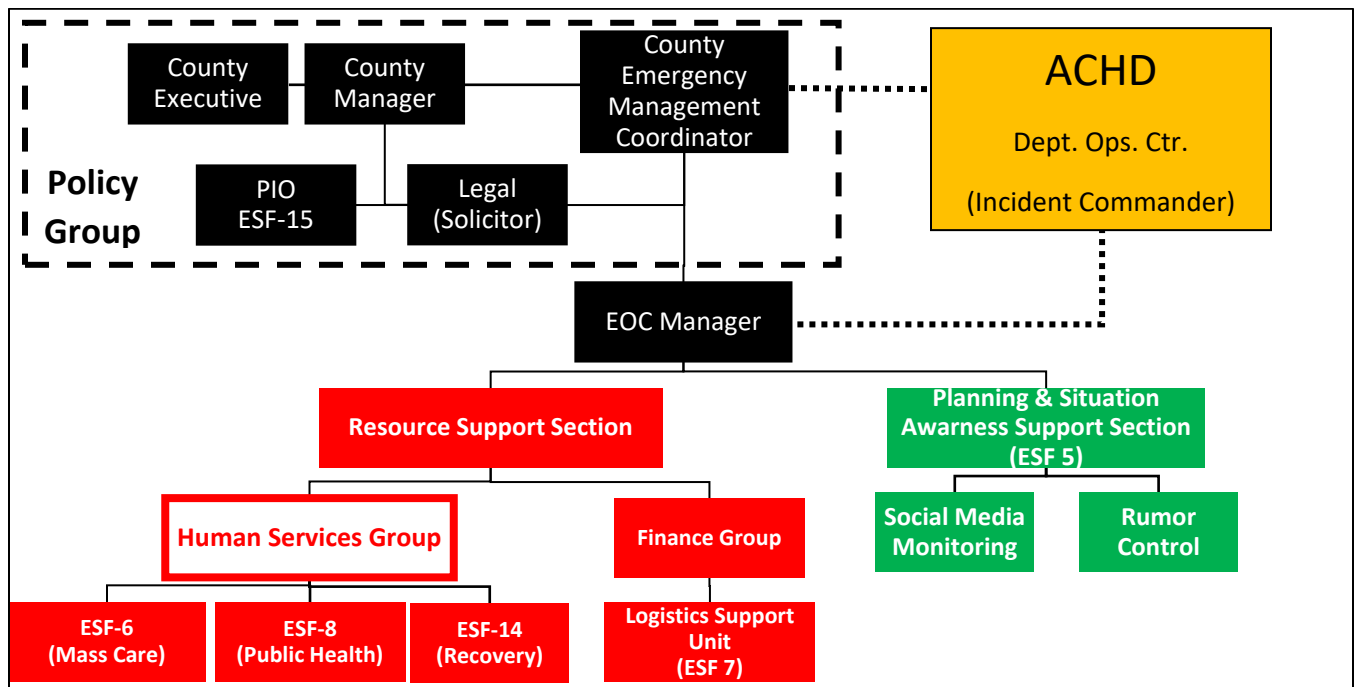

CURRENT SITUATION

As of March 11, 2020, WHO has declared the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) a pandemic.

The Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) has developed a strategic framework, outlined in the Pandemic Influenza Response Appendix for ACHD and support partners responding to, and sustaining functionality during a health emergency such as the COVID-19. The ACHD has activated its Departmental Operations Center (DOC) to monitor the emergence of the disease and to coordinate public health and medical aspects of the response.

- On March 13, 2020 the United States declared a national emergency.
- On March 19, 2020 Governor Wolf has ordered all “non-life sustaining businesses” in PA to physically close at 20:00 (8 pm) on March 19th.

- Community spread has occurred in Allegheny County, but not yet declared “sustained.”
- The American Red Cross faces blood shortage; 2,700 blood drives canceled due to concerns about coronavirus outbreak.
- On March 19th, the PA Department of Health confirmed the first COVID-19 related death in Pennsylvania (Northampton County).
- On March 21st Allegheny County confirmed it’s first COVID-19 related death. The second in Pennsylvania.

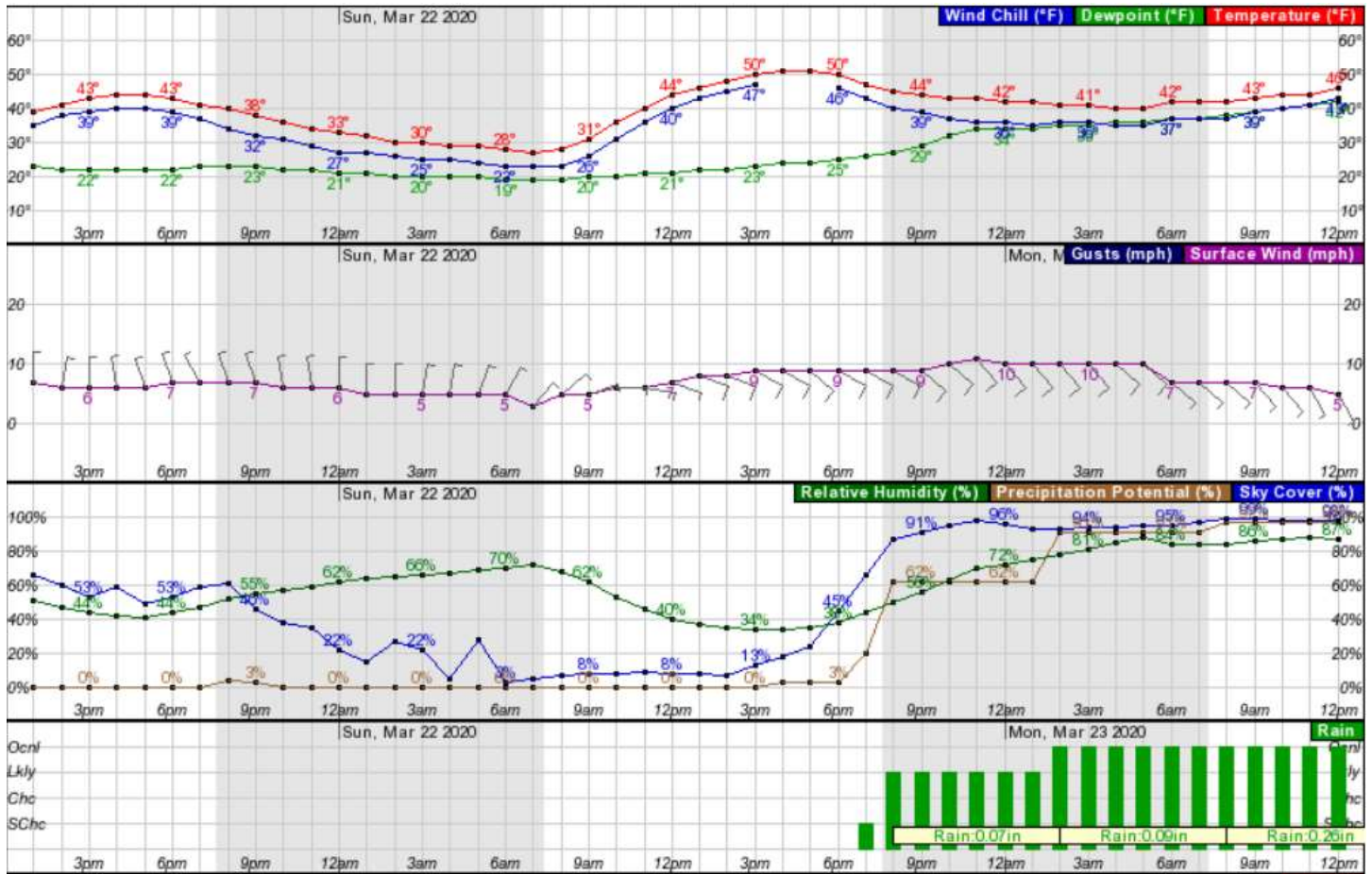

ACCOMPLISHMENTS (past 24 hours):

Allegheny County Health Department:

- The Allegheny County Health Department today confirmed the first death in our county from COVID-19. The person was an adult who had been hospitalized. There will not be any additional information provided at this time in order to respect the family's privacy. A media briefing will be held later this afternoon with details forthcoming.
- ACHD suspended specimen collection over the weekend and will resume on Monday.
- ACHD case update status: Total of 31 today. Five individuals are hospitalized with the remainder in self-isolation at home.
- Staffing adjustments continue to be made to meet operational needs.
- Contact tracing for the confirmed cases continues

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- EOC Structure established and planning for additional staffing continues
- Maintaining Social Distancing via Virtual EOC activation via Microsoft teams.
- Sharing Resource distribution in daily SitReps
- Added to the EOC Structure: ESF-14 Recovery, Rumor Control, and Social Media Monitoring

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Continued posting messages and resource links to social media for public engagement
- Planning for the weekend (addressing staff changes and provider needs)
- Created food distribution map to help identify food donation sites

CHALLENGES:

Allegheny County Health Department:

- Receiving a high volume of calls regarding non-essential businesses in operation that are not directly regulated by ACHD
- ACHD working on a method to share information regarding cases with responders, yet to be finalized.

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- Ongoing need for supplies, particularly cleaning supplies and masks/gloves for home visits
- Providers starting to have staffing concerns, as many who rely on a lot of volunteers not currently getting that help.

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Ongoing need for supplies, particularly cleaning supplies and masks/gloves for home visits
- Possible weekend effect for provider staff reductions
- Evaluating changes and reductions, Travelers Aid and Transportation services

PLANNED ACTIVITIES (next 24 to 72 hours):

Allegheny County Health Department:

- Share information on hospital sample collection for the public on our web page.

- Staff Virtual EOC with an ACHD representative.
- Develop enforcement strategy for environmental health programs, especially for food facilities, in light of the Governor's order from yesterday.

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- Continue to distribute supplies as available to public safety partners
- Consider establishing a Joint Information Center/System
- 911 Center Pandemic Planning to sustain critical operations
- Building and systems to be sanitized

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Beginning to work with hotels to prepare for placement of isolated shelter folks.
- Working with United Way, who is organizing volunteer mobilization.
