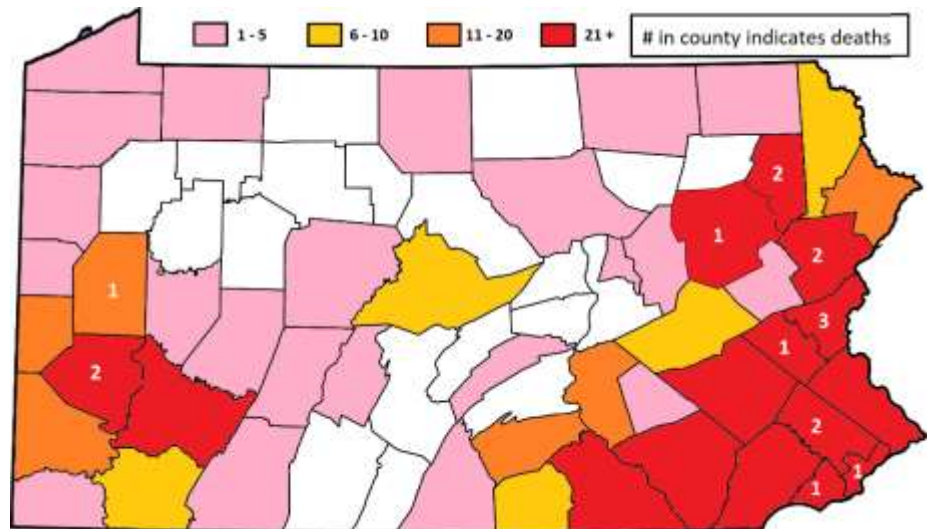

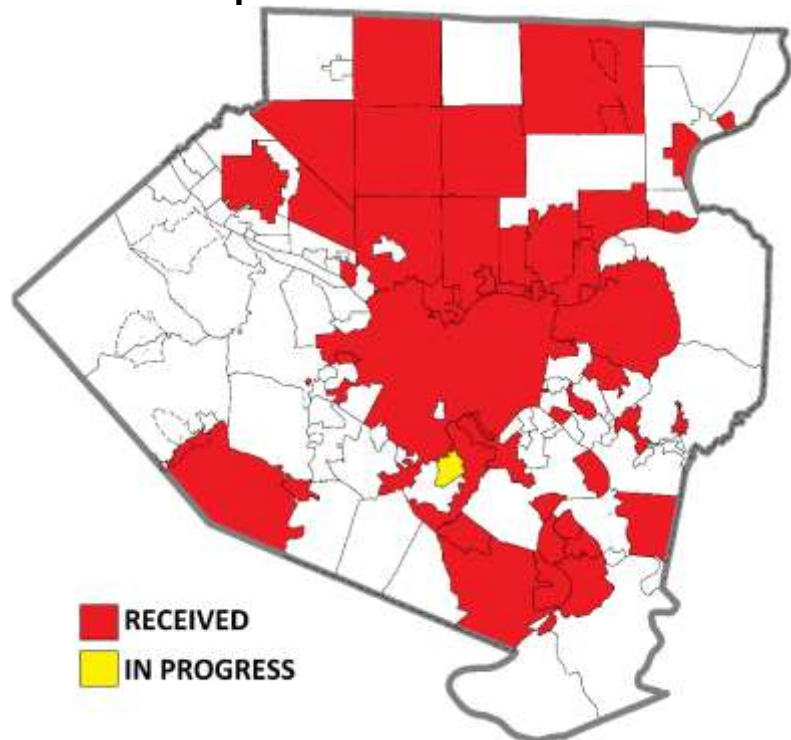

COVID-19 CASE COUNTY vs. FATALITIES:



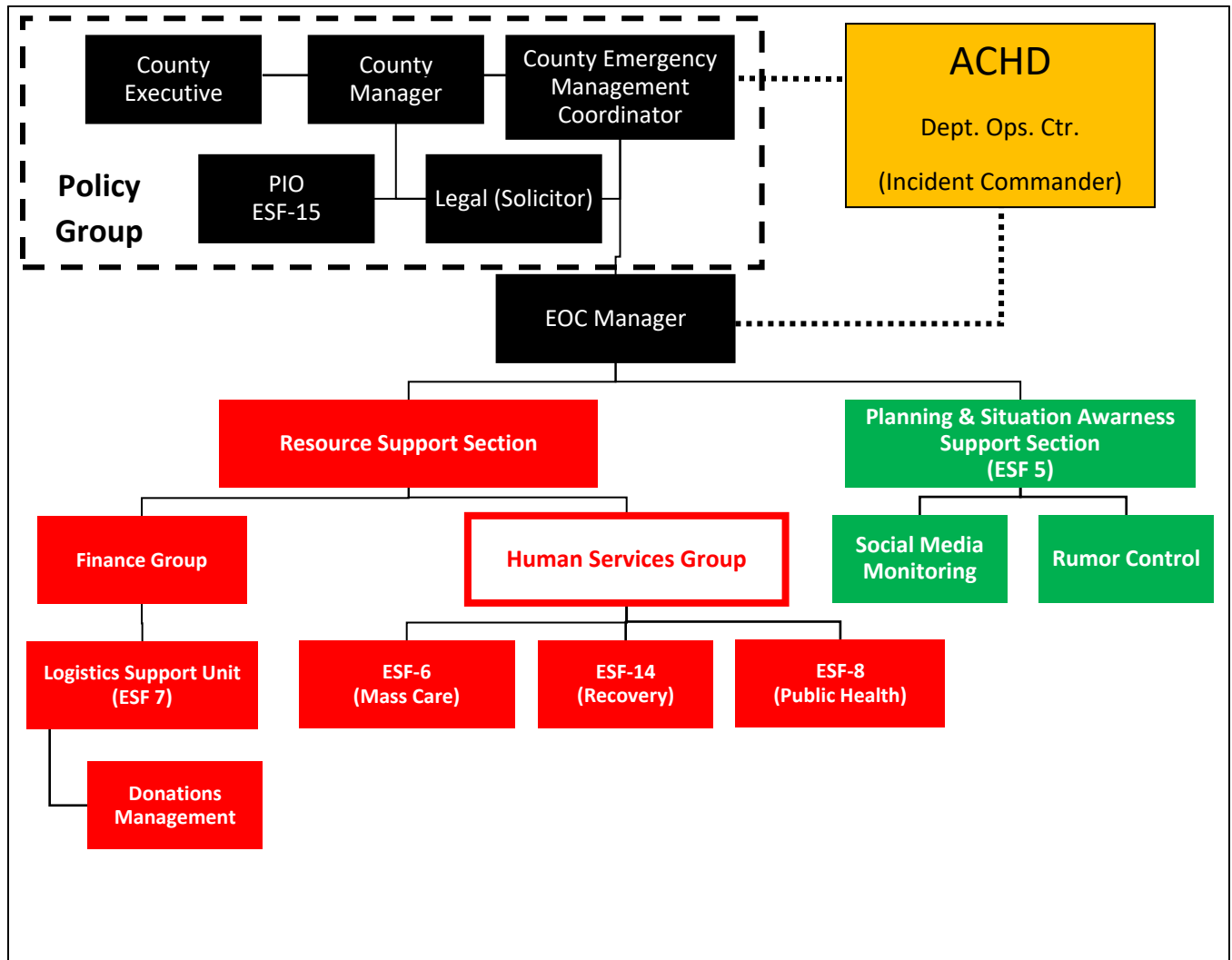

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CURRENT SITUATION

As of March 11, 2020, WHO has declared the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) a pandemic.

The Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) has developed a strategic framework, outlined in the Pandemic Influenza Response Appendix for ACHD and support partners responding to, and sustaining functionality during a health emergency such as the COVID-19. The ACHD has activated its Departmental Operations Center (DOC) to monitor the emergence of the disease and to coordinate public health and medical aspects of the response.

- On March 13, 2020 the United States declared a national emergency.
- On March 19, 2020 Governor Wolf has ordered all “non-life sustaining businesses” in PA to physically close at 20:00 (8 pm) on March 19th.

- Community spread has occurred in Allegheny County, but not yet declared “sustained.”
- The American Red Cross faces blood shortage; 2,700 blood drives canceled due to concerns about coronavirus outbreak.
- On March 19th, the PA Department of Health confirmed the first COVID-19 related death in Pennsylvania (Northampton County).
- On March 21st Allegheny County confirmed its first COVID-19 related death. The second in Pennsylvania.
- On March 23rd the Governor places a Stay at Home Order on Allegheny County.

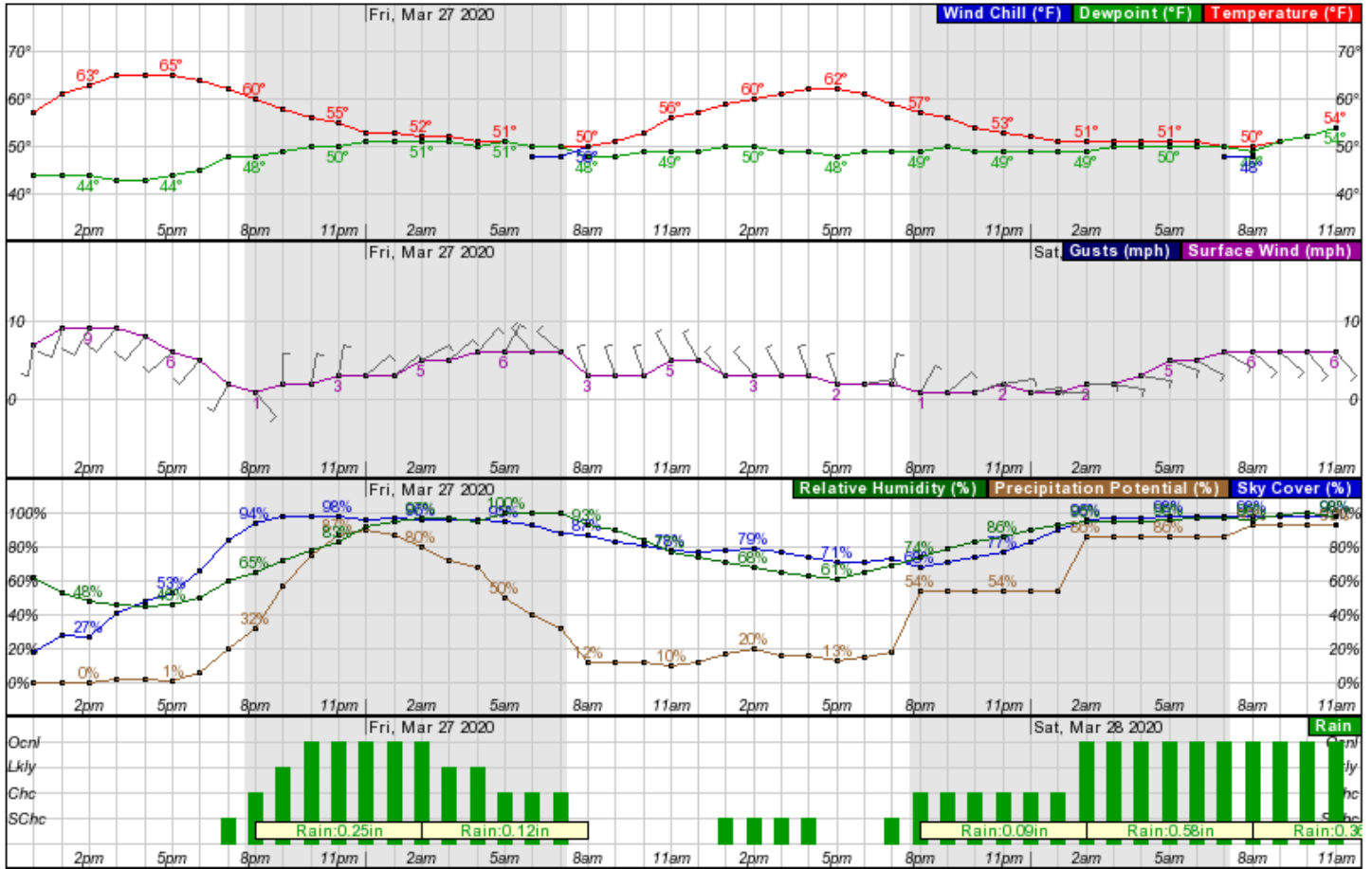

Furthermore, you may not receive 100% of what you request immediately. We must make sure everyone receives some and then we will distribute more subsequently

Allegheny County Health Department:

- ACHD case update status: Total of 133 active today, 20 hospitalized, 2 deaths.
- ACHD continues collecting specimens for cases under investigation.

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- Adding Volunteer and Donations Management under ESF:14
- All EMS callers will now be receiving COVID-19 screening questions.
- Created Regional EMS Working Group for planning.

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Continued posting messages and resource links to social media for public engagement
- Began addressing issues surrounding employee self-care
- Devised a process to collect, answer, and share out frequently asked questions from our providers

CHALLENGES:

Allegheny County Health Department:

- ACHD working on a method to share information regarding cases with responders, yet to be finalized.
- Gauging ACHD specimen collection demand. With additional healthcare specimen collection available, the demand on ACHD's site may remain light.
- Uncertain how ACHD sampling demand may be affected with the increase in cases.

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- Ongoing need for supplies, particularly cleaning supplies and masks/gloves for home visits.
- Providers starting to have staffing concerns, as many who rely on a lot of volunteers not currently getting that help.

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Ongoing need for supplies, particularly cleaning supplies and masks/gloves for home visits
- Reports of phone scams for seniors (people claiming to be from the CDC asking for credit card/personal info)

PLANNED ACTIVITIES (next 24 to 72 hours):

Allegheny County Health Department:

- Share information on hospital sample collection for the public on our web page.
- Staff Virtual EOC with an ACHD representative.
- Finalize enforcement strategy for environmental health programs, especially for food facilities, in light of the Governor's order.



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- Evaluate options for additional specimen collection opportunities.

Allegheny County Emergency Services:

- Work with ACHD for future testing sites.
- Continue to distribute supplies as available to public safety partners
- 911 Center Pandemic Planning to sustain critical operations
- Provide guidance for non-emergency transport agencies to support ancillary functions (i.e.: dialysis).

Allegheny County Human Services:

- Daily provider calls to discuss plans and assess needs
- Developing contingency plans for food sites that need to close for staffing or other reasons
